- Bayard de Rosslyn. Name and device. Vert, a harp and in chief a rose Or.
- Elspeth inghean Conaill. Name.
- Fabian Sable. Name.
- Gwen verch David. Badge change. Gules semy of bees Or. Nice badge!
- Rúnfríðr Keiliselgr. Badge. (Fieldless) A lozenge purpure. Nice badge!
- Thomas Tailor of Politarchopolis. Name.
- Thora Grímsdóttir of Southron Gaard. Device. Per bend sinister bevilled gules and sable, two wolf's heads argent.
- Uriangkhai-yin Cirina Soqor. Badge. Per chevron sable and argent, two bees Or and a lotus flower in profile purpure, in base a cloud purpure.
- Vérún Geirsdóttir. Device. Argent, on a pale endorsed sable between two feathers azure a flame and a chalice argent.
- Ysemay the Needle. Name and device. Argent, two ravens respectant each

maintaining a rapier sable, on a chief vert an arrow argent.

- Blythe Venell. Device. Sable, on a fess azure fimbriated engrailed between three serpents nowed, three roses Or.
- Blythe Venell. Badge. Per chevron inverted sable and azure, a rose and two serpents glissant addorsed in chevron inverted Or.
- Ealasaid Sionnach. Name and device. Per chevron gules and argent, a crescent pendant azure fimbriated argent and a fox's mask gules maintaining a trefoil knot vert. Nice cant on sionnach, meaning fox!
- Maes de Cuyper. Name. Nice late 15th century Dutch name!
- Svanhildr Skaldadóttir. Name.
