It is again my pleasure to proclaim those that have been successful in registering their names, devices or badges as of the last Letter (April).

*** Alexandra Hartshorne.** Badge.

Argent, within and conjoined to a triangle voided the Roman capital letter H azure.

*** Ares humnoidos.** Badge.

Per saltire argent and azure, on a sun Or a gridiron sable, in chief a prawn gules. This badge was pended on the January 2025 LoAR to redraw the sun in a period style.

*** Awly the Grim.** Name and device.

Per chevron inverted throughout sable and argent, a tricorporate rabbit argent and two carrots proper.

*** Blythe Venell.** Name

The submitter requested authenticity for 16th century English. This name meets that request. (see RETURNS for device).

*** Claricia filia Wilelmi dapiferi.**

Blanket permission to conflict with device.

Argent, a chevron between three hound's heads erased azure.

*** Collette de Harecourt.** Badge.

Per pale azure and sable, a horse courant argent.

*** Harfas Kysla.** Name.

Submitted as Hárfás Kysla, the submitter has requested that the accents be dropped. We have thus done so.

*** Julyan Graye of London.** Name.

Nice name for 1541 London!

*** Mariota Blackwood and Dietrich Lehrer.**

Joint household name Casa de Fiore and badge. Per pale gules and vert, a rose Or within an annulet argent.

*** Raw Pengwyne.** Name and device.

Argent, a penguin gules bellied erminois and a bordure azure. Raw is a variant of Ralph. Nice 16th century Cornish name!

*** Rúnfríðr Keiliselgr.** Badge for Haus zum Höffles. (Fieldless) On a maueranker palewise per pale

purpure and vert a hausmarke in the shape of a rogacina triply crossed and fourchy the upper crossbar bendwise sinister argent. The anille or maueranker is fesswise by default.

*** Tassilon Fetherstonhaughe.**

Alternate name Olivier le Fol and badge. Gules ermined, two fish haurient addorsed argent.

*** Tassilon Fetherstonhaughe.**

Alternate name Ricca di Firenze.

*** Wahriia of Saint Christina the**

Astonishing. Badge. (Fieldless)

An owl displayed Or maintaining in both feet an ankh sable.

*** Wahriia of Saint Christina the**

Astonishing.

Transfer of badge to Amalie Reinhardt. (Fieldless) A platypus azure.

The accompanying Cover letter stated "A few submissions this month caused us to consider the per chevron inverted throughout division". Because of this, we will no longer register armory using the per chevron inverted throughout division as of the October 2025 Wreath meeting. For clarity, this only applies to per chevron inverted throughout, not a standard per chevron inverted.

In general, combining a field division with a parallel (or roughly parallel) peripheral ordinary such as per pale and a tierce, or per fess and a chief or base - creates such ambiguity, and will not be registerable going forward without documentation of the practice.

Still awaiting the latest Letter of Acceptances and returns (May) so as soon as it is published I will send it out and report in next months CAMEL.
