The submitter provides documentation that Alfred the Great's wife was called Ealhswith in various spellings including Æthelswith /Ethelswith and Elswiths from The New Encyclopsedia Britanica Volume 1 15th Ed 1991, The Anglo-Saxon Chronicles trans by Anne Savage, The Anglo Saxons by David Wilson, The life and times of Alfred the great" by Douglas Wouldruff. The submitter also argues that dropping the "a" from the end of the third spelling and using a "y" instead of an "i" is reasonable. The submitter claims that "of" is old English, and Bery is the last part of her mundane name and the Decion ap Dyfrwr Trefriw (Then Rocket Pursuivant) dated it to 1327 as "act Bery"

Consulting Herald: Decion and Tariq ibn Deal in Ziyadafallgh al Nayabari for the name and just the latter for the device.

Salient Comments: There seems no doubt that Alfred the greats wife was called Elswitha, Aethelswith and Ealhswith. So I don't see too much problem with the first name but that's an opinion not proof. Bery again only statement of fact I can find Berie dated to 1086 on p39 of Ekwall, so it should be OK. Please people documentation. As for the device, I said last time that devices should be coloured in pen, this is not a rule devices sent in using coloured pencil and the like with get posted, but remember it looks better in solid colours. << Hint - if something looks good human nature gives it a better shot especially if it judged on artwork>> The device however is a bunch of holly berries, whilst I am not sure if it can be blazoned this way the 3,2,1 is default and hence not required.

Harpy: I'm curious as to what part of her name she thinks is "Celtic". Boehler (p.30) has "AEthelswyth" from a 9th century entry in the Anglo-Saxon chronicle, while the same name shows up in Selten (v.II p.21) as "Elswith" in 14th century surname examples and as "Aylwyth" in a 13th century surname example (ibid p.34). The same source has the name appearing as a given name as late as the 13th century, so it is probably valid to consider these sumame spellings as being valid for the given name. Reaney DES (p.41 under "Berry") notes "Hubert Bery" (1268), and "William ate Bery" (1327). With regard to the preposition, I would like to respond to one claim in the original post:

"OK lets get something straight "of" is not old English, and very few people used "of" as an article in a locative."

It's hard to find "of" in locative bynames in the Middle English period and later, because by the time the sorts of documents in which names were recorded were no longer being written in French or Latin, people had switched to hereditary surnames for the most part. However, the word "of" is a genuine Anglo-Saxon preposition with roughly the same meaning as today, and there are early examples of "of" in locative bynames. Tengvik (p.123) has twelve difference citations of names of the pattern "<given name> of cproper name of place>" with dates ranging from the
10th to early 12th centuries, eg., "Blacman of Flotbeame" (1100). It is less common
than locatives with "aet", "de", and "on", but it is one correct option.
}

Both sources are in French but translation is provided. It was also decided that as Breton looks like Welsh that the adjective in this case glas would come last, hence Kraé Glas. (That's how we found the components. We only had Breton-French Dictionaries not the other way round sc we looked for words like the Welsh equivalent and then puzzled out there meaning from the French. A very slow process but that's what they wanted. Of course this word was in fact nothing to with Welsh and found by chance but words like Koad and Coed meaning woods are common.) Also listed is the alternative of Kraé -Grae. "K" is the same as "C" in Breton, if fact the alphabet is a,b,k,d,e,f,g,h,i,ch,c'h,l... that's what you get for not writing down a language l

Consulting Herald: Thomas Flamanc of Kelsale (Yes me again if you hadn't already noticed.)

Salient Comments: I cannot really provided any truly unbiased opinions, but the concept of a blue strand is not that hard to believe when you compare it to the Cote D'Azure. I am not sure if this is period at this stage but I will find out. Even still I think it should be OK. If someone can convince me otherwise I will boy opinion, even if I don't like it. As for the device I gave it a check of "Lau. and the O and A and it seems clear.

Harpy: (Oh goody, Breton!) Could you give me more details on the dictionary entry for "kraé"? I can't confirm this word in any of my Breton dictionaries. It could simply be a dialectal spelling - the spelling system in my dictionaries never has accents on "e", so there's a difference to start with. (I have a slight advantage over you folks in the way of dictionaries - I have a Welsh-Breton one! More useful to me personally than the Breton/French-French/Breton one, but still the wrong direction for this instance.) Ah, wait a minute, I can find: "grae - greve [strand] plage [beach]". There are certain circumstances in which "g" mutates to "k" in Breton, but none of them seem likely to be at work here. I'll go back to my "dialect' theory. "Grae" (or "krae" presumably) is a feminine noun and, as in Welsh, adjectives lenite after feminine nouns, but not to the same sound. In Breton, "glas" would lenite to "c'hlas" (but pronounced with a voiced "ch" as opposed to the sound that "c'h" stands for when it isn't representing lenited "g" - confused?). So assuming that "kraé" is a valid dialectal spelling of the word my dictionary has as "grae", the phrase would be "Kraé c'hlas". "Glas", by the way, has the same types of color meanings in Breton as it does in Welsh (and Irish): blue, "plant" green, grey, pale A grey, pebbly beach would normally be described with this color word. (You car still send people from my Breton class into fits of giggles with the phrase "Glas ec ar mor, ha brav eo an amzer." [The sea is blue, and the weather is fine.] - but I gues: you had to be there.)

Decision: Of course Harpy is an expert in Breton, why not she's an expert in every other Celtic language, but in the light of her evidence this name will be submitted as Krae C'hlas. She is in fact correct our reference states Krae and Grae a: interchangeable. A new petition has been provided.
