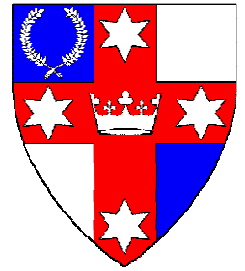

Submissions

Cost: Submissions are currently being paid for by the Crown. This policy will be in place until at least the end of 2010 at which point it will be reviewed and possibly extended.

Copies required:

NAMES: Two (2) copies of both the form, any permissions to conflict and ALL documentation, including title page of each book **NB: The title page is not the same as the book cover!** Persona essays may be entertaining, but do NOT constitute documentation. When citing web sites as documentation, you must include a printout of the pages used.

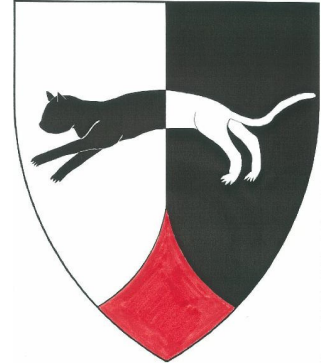
DEVICES AND BADGES: Four (4) colour copies and one (1) black & white OUTLINE copy. Three (3) copies of any additional documentation or permissions to conflict. The colour copies should be accurately coloured, preferably in texta. Unacceptable methods of colouring include colour printing or photocopying, crayon, faint pencil, and gel pen.

Please include **ALL** necessary documentation to support each submission. It is the responsibility of the submitter to present their submission in a way that makes registration easy. Name documentation should be as accurate as possible. Failure to provide sufficient documentation is a cause for return of your submission. If you are having trouble with your documentation then speak to your local herald. If they can't answer your specific question, consider writing to Blazons, posting in the Basilisk forums or contacting me. Please don't staple your forms; paperclips are fine and loose is better.

1: Alliette Delecourt - New Device

Per pale argent and sable, a cat courant counterchanged and a point pointed gules



2: Cormac Ó Treassaigh - New Name & New Device

Vert, a triskelion argent and a chief checky sable and argent

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Language (Celtic/Irish Gaelic) most important.

Culture (Celtic/Irish Gaelic) most important.

Submitted as *Cormacc Ó Tressach*, the original documentation was:

Cormacc - Middle Irish header form in OC&M, page 60.

Tressach - Middle Irish header form in OC&M, page 172.

Both the given name and patronymic are Middle Irish while the article Ó is Early Modern Irish. The patronymic also needs to be in the genitive case.

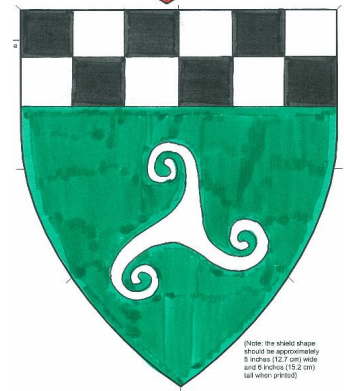
The Lochac College presented the submitter with a range of grammatically and linguistically consistent spelling options, from which the submitter chose the Early Modern form *Cormac Ó Treassaigh*:

Cormac - standard Early Modern Irish spelling given in "Index of Names in Irish Annals: Cormacc / Cormac" by Mari Elspeth nic Bryan (<http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/Masculine/Cormacc.shtml>)

St Gabriel's report 3336 (<http://www.panix.com/~gabriel/public-bin/showfinal.cgi/3336.txt>) which says <Cormac> is an excellent choice for a 16th century Irish Gaelic given name.

Treassaigh - Early Modern Irish variant genitive spelling found in several entries in "Index of Names in Irish Annals: Tressach" by Mari Elspeth nic Bryan (<http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/Masculine/Tressach.shtml>)

The similar spelling <Ó Treasaigh> can be found in "16th & 17th Century Anglicized Irish Surnames from Woulfe" by Mari ingen Briain meic Donnchada (http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/Woulfe/SortedByGaelicRoot_T.shtml).



3: Elisabet von Tecklenburg - New Name & New Device

Argent, on a lozenge palewise throughout purpure a ewe passant argent

Submitter desires a feminine name.

Elisabet - Bahlow, Deutches Namenlexicon s.n. Elizabeth has Dietrich Elisabet dated to 1289.

von Tecklenburg - Standard German marked locative name. The spelling <Tecklenburg> is found in Brechenmacher, s.n. Tecklenburg, Christophe Tecklenburg dated 1558.

The submitter has included permissions to conflict with the following two badges:

Crystal Mynes, Shire of

The following badge associated with this name was registered in May of 2008 (via Calontir):

Argent, on a lozenge purpure a pickaxe argent.

George Emerson True

The following badge associated with this name was registered in March of 1988 (via the East):

Argent, on a lozenge palewise throughout purpure, a winged lion rampant guardant to sinister, wings elevated and addorsed, argent.

4: Lochac, Kingdom of - New Badge

(Fieldless) On an escallop argent in cross four mullets of eight points gules

This submission is to be associated with *Cross of Lochac, Order of the*

5: Rodrigo de Burgos - New Name Change & New Device

Gules, a trestle argent

Old Item: *James the Unknown*, to be retained.

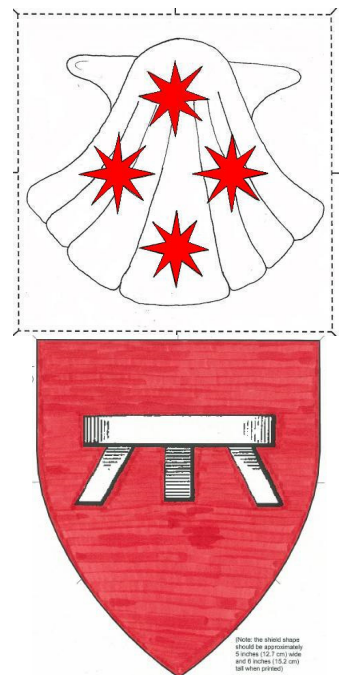
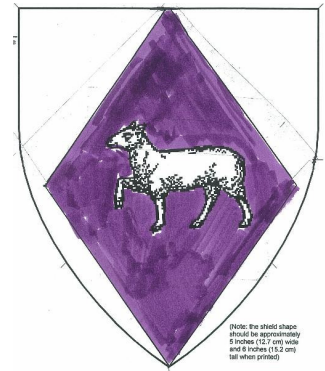
Submitter desires a masculine name.

Rodrigo - 11 instances of this given name in "16th Century Spanish Names" by Elspeth Anne Roth (<http://heraldry.sca.org/laurel/names/spanish/male-given-alpha.html>)

de Burgos - 9 instances of this locative by-name in "16th Century Spanish Names" by Elspeth Anne Roth (<http://heraldry.sca.org/laurel/names/spanish/locatives-freq.html>)

The submitter has used the three-legged trestle as depicted in Parker's Glossary (<http://www.heraldsnet.org/saitou/parker/Jpglosst.htm#Tressel>).

We would argue that this heraldic trestle should be considered significantly different from the table-trestle registered by Katherina Morneweghe, *Gules, a table-trestle Or* [December 2009, A-Drachenwald] (<http://oscar.sca.org/index.php?action=145&id=11070>). However, in case the College of Arms and Wreath as Sovereign disagree, Katherina Morneweghe has



kindly given permission to conflict with her device.

6: Wulfric Halvedievel - New Device

Argent, a wolf rampant regardant and on a chief sable three Maltese crosses argent

Kingdom commenters noted the following two close-but-not-conflicts:

Sophia Mikhailovna Serpukhova

*The following device associated with this name was registered in May of 1992 (via Caid):
Argent, two wolves combattant, on a chief sable three patriarchal crosses argent.*

One CD for changing the number of wolves (X.4.f) and the second for substantially changing the type of tertiary (X.4.j.ii) as per the May 2009 cover letter, patriarchal crosses and Maltese crosses are substantially different.

Gunnolf of Mwre

The following device associated with this name was registered in March of 2005 (via the Middle):

Argent, a wolf rampant and on a bordure sable three crosses patonce argent.

One CD for changing the type of secondary (X.4.e) and the second for substantially changing the type of tertiary (X.4.j.ii) as per the May 2009 cover letter, crosses patonce and Maltese crosses are substantially different.

Kingdom level returns:

Malasen de Hellam - New Name - Returned for insufficient documentation.

The photocopy provided was a single page from an unspecified book. Documentation should always include the title page of the book and in this case, should also include the page of footnotes or endnotes where the source of the name elements was shown.

The documentation provided additionally shows the spelling <Malasens>, not <Malasen> and no argument for the variation was provided.

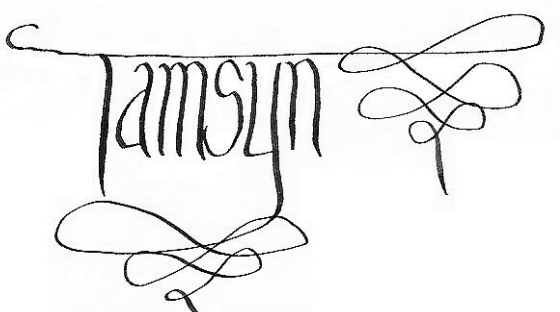
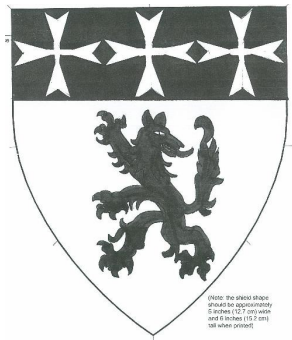
Malasen de Hellam - New Device – *Gules, a base argent, overall a wyvern Or* – Returned for administrative and style reasons.

The submission only included 2 colour copies and 1 line drawing copy of the device forms. 4 colour copies and 1 line drawing copy are required.

A design including only an overall charge and a peripheral ordinary is not period style and is therefore unregistrable.
