Device submission from Olwyn Yr Gogh for a name and device: Quarterlt Azure and Ermine, on a cross Gules fimbriated Or, between in bend two crescents a ram's head caboshed Argent. This device was sent to Kingdom on 24 January after consultation with Hrolf Herjolfssen. Thus it should be considered at the February meeting of the College of the West Kingdom and then be considered by Laurel King of Arms at his May meeting and therefore the device could be passed and the result known before Oywyn steps down from her term as Vicereine of Lochac , just.

\*\*Firiel\* is Sindarin, and means "mortal woman". It was registered previously to firiel Lokrien MacGowan (November XV).

Morwenna of Oystermouth

New, name and device.

Purpure, a flute fesswise Or.

According to the <u>Encyclopedia Brittanica</u>, this type of flute was known in Europe from approximately 1100 on.

Reynardine of Tara

Device resubmission to Laurel, name pending.

Vert, a fox's mask Or, a bordure wavy ermine.

His previous device submission of "Vert, a fox's mask proper within a bordure wavy ermine" was returned by Laurel in June XIX for insufficent contrast.

Firiel of the Green Wood

Name submitted, device returned.


Argent, a dragon rampant gules, a peach tree fructed, and a pilgrim's staff


proper, one and two.

This device is not acceptable period style, for several reasons. First, it uses three different charges, of three colors, two of which are "proper". Second, they are in a non-standard arrangement, i.e. one and two. Third, the charges are of sufficently different visual weight that the device is severely unbalanced. (For instance, if she had used a staff and a sword for the lower two charges, the device would have been more <a href="mailto:balanced">balanced</a>. However, it would still not have been acceptable.) The Rules of Submission state that we are emulating the clear, simple heraldry of the 12th-14th C., and allow submissions to be returned if they deviate <a href="mailto:excessively">excessively</a> from that style. We know of no period examples of devices which use design similar to this device. For further discussion on period style, see the T.I. article by Mistress Hilary of Serendip, enclosed.

As this lady is a branch herald, she should have a device which will serve as a good example for the people in her group.

None of her alternates changed the problems with the design.





Alesandro l'Argentiere (submitted as Alessandro d'Argentiera). Name and device. Gules, a mullet of eight points within a cogwheel within an orle, all Or.

NOTE: According to Brigantia, <u>d'Argentiera</u> is not Latin for "of the Aegean." At her suggestion, we have substituted <u>l'Argentiere</u> 'the silversmith' in order to register the device. Batonvert has pointed out that Cimolus, an island in the Aegean, is known in Italian as <u>Argentiera</u>; is this, perhaps, what the submitter had in mind?

Rowany, Barony of. Device. Per chevron dovetailed argent and vert, two rowan trees fructed and eradicated proper and a laurel wreath argent.

DISCUSSION: The fruit of the rowan tree is gules.

## RETURNS

Lochac, Region of. Crux Herald (name only).

NOTE: They will need to add an adjective to render this title sufficiently different from that of the Rouge Croix Pursuivant.


The following chess pieces have been approved for use as charges in  ${\sf SCA}$  heraldry:
