Counting Down To Freedom!

If you have been following the Camel recently you will be aware that I get out of this job come Twelfth Night. By the time September Coronet comes around, I will have chosen and announced a successor. Following that, I'll be commencing a phased transfer of Crux resources and responsibilities to the poor sod, so that by the time January comes around he/she will be functioning as Crux in all but name. During that three month period of transfer, there will be some unavoidable confusion and delay in the conduct of business. (That is, of course, in addition to the normal confusion and delay you have all come to expect of me. (I wish that was a joke.)) The most immediate result will be that, effective from October 1st, all submissions will get their preliminary review from my successor, and should be addressed to him/her. Don't worry if you send it to me out of habit - I'll be forwarding mail regularly.

What I ask of you all is that you cut my replacement some slack for the first few month of the office. Please avoid threatening letters and 10.00 PM phone calls until he/she has a grip on the job.

Before you ask - Yes, I have recieved an acceptable offer of a successor. I'm not telling you who the poor soul is yet because the deadline for applications has not yet closed, and it is theoretically concievable that I might get a better offer.

Sundry Bits and Pieces

The Camel this month does not have any summarised commentary due unexpected problems that I won't go into. Next months issue is expected to include two sets of such commentary. In addition, Vesper has now arranged to send me the minutes of the Vesper meetings on disk, and is sending me the minutes of the last three months or so that we have missed. This issue may be a bit thin, but the next couple will probably make up for it.

Voices from the Wilderness

An apology is due here. Sir Kane Greymane sent the following letter in late April. It arrived and immediately got misfiled. It is reproduced here four months late. (Perhaps you can see why I'm not extending my term of office. These administrative failures are bad for buisness.)

"LOCHAC HERALDIC POLICY - "Encourage people to submit."

I beg and implore you to change this policy in part. I agree that name registration is a valid exercise at this time in heraldic history within the SCA, as people get very used to their name and the names of their friends. I strongly disagree with encouraging new members of the populace (and in fact any member of the populace who has not got an Award of Arms or greater) to register a device.

Many years ago when the Society was small and the heralds had not much to do, this policy may have had validity, but certainly no forward thinking or vision of the future. Today, 30 years on and 20,000+ members, we have all the work we would want, and books clogged with lovely heraldry denied active people because some short-sighted herald encouraged a newcomer to register a device, which he did, then promptly left the SCA never to return or even think about his device again. At our level we can do nothing about the mistakes of the past, but we are responsible for the present - the past we leave to the future.

My Lord, please let us not force upon even the armigerous the need to register. Let the King do it in the Award ceremony, for in my own Barony many armigers with registered arms have fallen away or do not display them.

When we go to kingdom, I feel our heraldic policy should be to stop registering devices and only register arms, and to educate the populace about monograms and the use of elements of their device as personal use / ownership badges and seals, so only household badges get registered.

But what if some new person wants to use a shield on the field? Good field divisions can't be registered alone any more, so they should be freely used with a charge going on later to be his or her arms, or a complete change. What better way to make an Award of Arms what it says it is?

LETTERS OF RETURN FROM INTERNAL COM-MENTARY.

Let us not forget that courtesy and grace are the cornerstones of our wonderful society. Even in print we must still be gentle and caring of our noble cousins. One comment just recently appalled many of the populace - a comment on the artistic capability and quality of heraldic compilation. Two reasons for this discourtesy come to mind, and they both need addressing.

First and foremost - The purpose of internal commenting:

As I understand it, internal commenting was done for two or three reasons

- a) to ensure a high registration rate for the populace, saving valuable months,
- b) to spread the workload so that Crux would not have to always be the best book herald in Australia to hold the job, and
- c) to give other heralds a chance to learn via participation.

Well, all laudable reasons! Where does it say be harsh, unkind and unhelpful? Where does it say "How many

can we bounce tonight?" or let me (the herald) feel good whilst I put someone else down. The standard of research is very average and does not back up this holier than thou attitude I see in letters of return.

The second reason is the tyranny of distance.

It is easy to forget we are all one family when we are 3000 miles+ away. Please let's make internal commenting be about how we can get this through with the minimum of trouble for our gentle cousin the submitter.§

I would like to recieve contributions on the issues Sir Kane has raised here, particularly the issue of registering the devices of the non-armigerous. It is certanly true that the heralds would save a good deal of effort and that a good number of future conflicts would be avoided under such a policy. It is equally true that the primary purpose of heraldry is unambiguous identification on the battlefield. Registration ensures that unambiguity. Should we deny this service to the non-armigerous?

These questions are not pointless discussion. I expect that Lochac will become a kingdom in a reasonably short time. We, as a college, will have to decide which policies of the West Kingdom College of Heralds to keep, which to change and which to dump. It is quite possible to accept a policy where only armigers are allowed to register devices. In fact, the Laws of the Kingdom could be so drafted that an Award of Arms carrys no title or precedence within Lochac until arms are registered. (Non-armigers can't register. Armigers must register.)

By the time these issues become urgent I will no longer be Crux. My successor will be looking for advice and opinions from you all. Please have something thoughtful and considered to offer, and remember that if you don't take part in the debate, you lose your right to complain about the results.§

History of Submission: The submitters previous name, together with her device of "Azure a demi-sun issuant from base Or on a chief argent three shamrocks vert" was registered by Laurel on Sept 29th 1990.

Citations / Documentation: The submitter has explained her reasons for seeking a change to this name at some length. Briefly, and in the order given - (a) she would like a name people can pronounce, (b)she tends to play in the late period English / Continental area now and would like a name appropriate for those spacetime coordinates, (c) wants to maintain an Irish link in the name and (d) wants to maintain a link with her mundane christian name. Documentation is provided for "Elayne" from Yonge, who gives it as as the old Cambrian form of the Welsh "Ellen" and cites it "from early times." Creswells "Bloomsbury Dictionary of First Names" derives the Elaine either from the Welsh 'Elain' or as an old French form of 'Helen'. Withycombe gives Elayne as derived from the old French form of Helen. He further states that it wasn't used as an ordinary Christian name until after 1859. The submitter contends that the name was known to people in period through fiction and legend, and there is no reason to suppose that it was not used.

Documentation for "Montjoy" is given from Bardsley "A Dictionary of English and Welsh Surnames", who cites 'Montjoy' from a marriage license from 1610. Reaney cites 'Montjoie' as a placename in Normandy, from which was derived the surnames 'Mountjoye' (1307), 'Munjoye' (1243) and various forms of de Mungay, etc.

Photocopies of all these references are provided.

Crux Commentary: The "Montjoy" component is quite satisfactorally documented by that marriage license. Although the SCA's cutoff date is 1600, we accept documented material from up to 1650 as compatable with our late period. The "Elayne" component is slightly shakier. The fiction and legend referred to by the submitter is Malory's "Mort d'Arthur" and other chansons de geste. While the name was definitely known in period, Elayne only came into common use after Tennyson wrote "Idylls of the King" in 1859, when he lifted the story of Lancelot and Elayne from Malory and dusted it off for a 19th century audience. However, Laurel has registered the name recently (Elayne Frampton, Oct 1991), and Iam unaware of any precedent or rules change that would make the name unacceptable now.

Recommendation: Pass name to Vesper.



Crux Commentary: It's clear.

Crux Commentary: Firstly, of all the names offered by the submitter, only the last alternate, Raven Whitelock, has a chance. Laurel has come down hard on overly metaphorical names recently, as research has shown that they simply were not used in our period. Mistweaver and Mistwanderer are very romantic, but they won't pass. In addition, I can find no support whatsoever for Ryvane or Ruvarn as names. I can't find any support for Raven, either, but I can at least say that it has been registered several times in the SCA, the most recent being Sept 1991 (Raven of Heronmarsh.) Whitelock, on the other hand is a good descriptive epithet which should pass with no problem. The device doesn't thrill me, but it seems to be legal and free of conflict. Recommendation: pass name as alternate Raven Whitelock, pass device.



Citations / Documentation: Ilina appears in the "Complete Russian Name Book" by Mistress Tatiana Nikolaevna on page 25, and Lyubasha (a diminutive of Lyubava) from the same source on page 30. No photocopy is provided. (My fault, I'm afraid. I informed the consulting herald that no photocopy was necessary because the book was in the Crux library. Unfortunately, I was thinking of the wrong book. I'm in the middle of ordering it from Thorfinn at the moment.) Zivanovic is sourced for Hanks and Hodges "Dictionary of Surnames" on p.593 as a variation on the old Slavic Zhivago. Photocopies are provided.

Crux Commentary: Lyubasha appears on page 191 of "Dictionary of Russian First Names A-Z" by N.A. Petrovskii TRANSLATED (!) by Mistress Tatiana Nikolaevna Tumanova. (Which is the book that I do have!) Ilina appears in the same source on page 170.

Recommendation: Forward name to Vesper. Retire Crux, he's going senile.

Please draw bells two on azure and two on gules". NO DEVICE CHANGES AT ALL WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION History of Submission: Jonathons name was recently passed to Vesper from Crux. Crux Commentary: About those notes to scribes. It won't be obvious from the mini-emblazon (which I had to draw up), but Jonathon has, indeed, drafted this design without any black outlines whatsoever, using lines for internal detail only. Shifting one of the bells on the neck to the other side will be a definite improvement of balance, although heraldically insignificant. The style seems acceptable. ALthough there a quite a few fields per pale azure and gules 'round the ridges, his single charge is unique enough to clear all conflicts. Recommendation: Pass to Vesper. Consulting herald: not listed. SCA name : Katherine Alicea of Sarum Mundane name : Kim Maynard Group : River Haven This submission : new name, new device Money recieved :\$15.00 for name, \$15.00 for device : Vert a bend bevilled between in bend sinister a swan naiant and a quarterfoil knot or. Blazon Permitted name changes :Language of name is given as English Permitted device changes : Notes to scribe: "The quarterfoil knot is drawn with the lobes in saltire." Citations / Documentation: "Katherine - see Withycombe. Alicea - see Withycombe under Alice." No photocopies are provided. Sarum is documented by photocopies from the Encyclopaedia Britannica showing Sarum to be the Anglo-Saxon name for Salisbury in England. Crux Commentary: Withycombe p.186 gives Katherine as one of the chief variant spellings of a name best known from St. Katherine, of 'Katherine Wheel' fame. On p.15 it is noted that the name Alice was being latinised as 'Alicia' in the 12th century. Withycombe does not document the spelling as used by the submitter, (Alicea). Still, the name comes in a wide range of variations, pronunciations and spellings, and this seems to me to be within the established range of variation.-eg. Alice, Aliz, Adaliz, Aaliz, Adalheidis, Alesia, Alicia, Alix, Athelesia, Alesia, Aelis, Alys, Alse. It would have been nice, though, if we had permission to make minor changes to spelling. The device appears to me to be in good style and free of conflict. Recommendation: Pass name and device to Vesper. Consulting herald: William Edward Castille. SCA name : Rohese de Fairhurst Mundane name : Meroe Cahill Group : Stormhold This submission :device resub to Crux Money recieved: not required for a resubmission. Blazon : Argent, ermined azure, issuant from the top of a fess, two trefoils sable. Permitted device changes: Important elements of the design are: charges, colours. History of submission: Rohese's previous design of "Vair en point, issuant from the top of a fess two trefoils sable" was returned by Crux in February 1994, for problems with contrast as drafted. Rateher than simply redraft, the submitter has redesigned the field. Crux Commentary: The contrast problem has been solved, and there are no conflicts apparent. Recommendation: Pass device on to Vesper. Consulting herald: none listed.




Citations / Documentation: Ute is documented from Hanks and Hodges p.327 as German medieval given name derived from the Germanic element 'uod(al)' - prosperity, riches, fortune, and is given as a feminine equivalent of Udo. Tangermünde is documented from Toynbee "Historical Atlas and Gazetteer", from a map of Germany c. 1375 showing the Hansa towns. Photocopies are provided from both sources.

Crux Commentary: Hanks and Hodges is not a highly respected reference in the college, and unfortunately the Crux library is light on Germanic name books. However, the name sounds reasonable to me. The Tangermünde component is well documented. The device is in good order and free of conflict, though I'm not sure what the college will make of the cloved lemons. Then again, if the lady goes berserk and starts gnawing the top of her shield, at least she'll have fresh breath...




