Unto the College of Heralds of the Kingdom of the West in the Principality of Lochac, from Gereint Scholar, Crux Australis Herald, Happy New Year and Welcome to AS XXIII.

The College of Heralds in the Principality of Lochac held its May meeting at The Scriptorium on Thursday 12th May, starting at 7.00pm or thereabouts. Present were Master Gereint Scholar, Crux Australis Herald; PEs At Large Baroness Aislinn de Valence and Robert Furness of Southwood; and Cornets/visitors Baron Tovye Woolmongere, Baroness Silfren the Singer and Gerald of Swinford.

Meetings

At our regular monthly meetings we look at the latest heraldic submissions from around Lochac, forwarding some to the Vesper Principal Herald, returning others to the submittor for further work. The next meeting is on Thursday 9th June, starting at 7.00pm at The Scriptorium, 230 Frome Street, Adelaide. The July meeting will be held as part of the Lochac Heraldic Symposium over the weekend of 2nd–3rd July at the College of Saint Bartholomew. The meetings after that are Thursday 14th July (in case work overflows from the Heraldic Symposium) and 11th August, starting at 7.00pm at The Scriptorium.

I also hold occasional irregular meetings to take care of any other business that crops up. If you want to be notified of these meetings, please let me know.

The Hund Pursuivant, Master Thorfinn Hrolfsson, holds weekly "Hund Meetings" to provide Lochac's comments on the heraldic submissions from other kingdoms. They provide an excellent opportunity to learn about conflict research. They're on Monday nights starting at 8.00pm somewhere in Stormhold [Melbourne]. Please check with Master Thorfinn before turning up anywhere, since the meetings tend to move about. You can call him on (03) 25-6348.

Correcting the Records

Over the next three months I'll be transferring most of Lochac's heraldic records to a computer database. This will make it a *lot* easier for me to provide the information required by the Prince and Princess, the Lochac Officers and you, the heralds of Lochac. I'll be able to provide information in new, more useful forms. And it'll mean I'll spend a lot less time at some of the routine tasks of being Crux Australis Herald.

However, I want to make sure the information I now have is as accurate as possible before I launch into the massive task of re-typing it. So I'd like you to help me.

I've enclosed a complete list of all the people in Lochac who should appear in the database. I've shown the awards they hold, the date they received those awards, and the names of the Royalty who gave the awards. And I've included information about registered names, devices and badges.

Could you please spend a little time going through this list, looking especially at the people from your area. Please correct any mistakes, especially those concerning the dates of awards, the names of Royalty who gave awards, the spelling of un-registered names and the ever-present possibility of people being left out altogether. I'd like to receive your corrected versions by 24th June. (Feel free to

mail it with your quarterly report, which will be due shortly after that.)

To make the job easier for you, take the list along to all the events you go to in the next few weeks. Ask people to look *themselves* up, and encourage others to go through the list too. The more people who look, the better chance we have of getting rid of all the mistakes.

I hope to distribute the first computer-generated records at the Heraldic Symposium. And speaking of the Symposium....

Heraldic Symposium

The College of Heralds is staging the first Lochac Heraldic Symposium in Melbourne on the weekend of 2nd-3rd July. Details of the event are enclosed with this letter.

I realize that for many of you it's a long way to travel and a lot of money to spend — especially so inconveniently close to the Midwinter Investiture, scheduled for the following weekend at the other end of Lochac. On the other hand, it should be useful and entertaining. If you're on the roster, please try to be there.

Here's some news that may influence your decision: The West Kingdom's chief herald, the Vesper Principal Herald, Mistress Alison von Markheim, *might* be at the event. I spoke with Mistress Alison the other day, and she told me that the Kingdom has agreed to pay half the estimated US\$1200 needed to bring her to the Symposium and to the Midwinter Investiture in River Haven. However, it depends on finance, so any help we can offer would be greatly appreciated. Again, I stress that for the moment it's only a *possibility* that Mistress Alison will be here — albeit a strong possibility.

Quarterly Reports

Some of the group heralds still haven't sent the quarterly reports that were due at the Rowany Festival. Perhaps this is due to confusion over who the report should have been sent to; since the due date is now long past, a copy to me will suffice. That said, however, I've yet to hear from Innilgard, Blessed Herman the Cripple, Parvus Portus, Mordenvale, Saint Ursula, Agaricus, Stormhold, Saint Swithun and the Northern Southern Lands. Innilgard and Blessed Herman have told me theirs will be arriving very soon. But Gentle People, if I don't hear from you soon, I'll be forced to write to your Seneschal and ask why you haven't reported yet. If you have sent a report, please send another copy, as I've obviously lost it while moving the files from Stormhold to Innilgard via Rowany.

Remember, your next report is due just before Midwinter in early July. Please try and get it to me by 30th June. If you're not sure what to include, write or call and I'll chat with you about my requirements.

Why Report Anyway?

Why all this carry-on about reports anyway? Here's four reasons why I find reports useful:

- It lets me know you've still interested in being the local herald for your group, and that you're actively doing the job.
- If you're got a problem, you can share it with me and maybe I can help.
 Moreover, if I see the same sorts of problems cropping up in several groups, I can do something about it.
- It's extremely useful to put things down in writing. Although we live in the age of the telephone, if something's written down it can be shared with others.
- I like the feedback. It lets me know my messages are getting through.

The Ideal Report

Ideally, your report should include as much information as possible. There's no need to go overboard; after all, I have to read everything you send. And if nothing much has happened, you can just write and say "nothing much has happened". But here's a few suggestions.

List the heraldic submissions you've sent since the previous report. I can check my records to make sure I haven't lost anything. Australia Post is generally quite good, but my desk occasionally eats thing. Tell me whether people with "returned" submissions are working on a resubmission.

Mention the events at which any Court, Field or Duty heraldry was done. Tell me who did it and whether they were any good. If there were problems, tell me what they were and how you solved them. I can pass on useful tips to others, and I can provide advice or training when it's needed. Send copies of any special ceremonies you wrote. Again, if they're good I can share the ideas with others.

List all the awards that were granted to people from your group. Include the date of the award and the names of the Royalty who gave it. This is a useful cross-check of my files, especially if the recipient hasn't registered their name. You wouldn't believe the strange spellings we sometimes get. Then again, maybe you would...

Tell me a little about each of the "At Large" heralds in your area: what they've been working on, what the quality of their work is like, and whether you think they're ready for promotion.

Your report needn't be anything fancy to look at. It doesn't even need to be typed — unless your handwriting is as disgusting as mine. The important thing is that the report appears.

Remember to put the date on your report, as well as your full name, address, telephone number and the name of the group you're from. People forget to tell me if they've changed their address. Putting it on the envelope isn't good enough, I'm afraid: I throw envelopes away as soon as they're opened. And unless I think about it, I won't notice that your address is different from the last time you wrote.

Give a copy of your report to your Seneschal. If you live in a Barony, a copy for the Baron and Baroness would be a nice touch. And if for some reason you can't report on schedule, please let me know.

Fees for Submissions

Since the submission fees are nice round values of \$US, the variable exchange rate means we have really strange fees here in Lochac. Despite a few recent hiccoughs, the rate seems to be steady around 0.72, so the fees look something like this:

Please check with me before sending large amounts of money: the exchange rate has a habit of changing without warning. If you don't like the odd numbers, you can always round the amount up to the nearest whole dollar, and call it a donation to the College.

Warning! This might be your last letter!

These monthly letters have been sent to more than 40 rostered heralds and other interested people around Lochac. Master Thorfinn has made them available for free, but this cost him a lot of money. Therefore, starting next month, these monthly letters will only be sent to you if you're the herald for a local group, or if you're the Hund Pursuivant, or if you pay the annual subscription of \$10.00. Remember, if you're not in the first two categories, and you haven't paid, then this is your last letter.

Once again, make your cheques payable to "SCA College of Heralds".

Of course, you're encouraged to photocopy these letters and distribute them as widely as you like. Nothing here is a secret, and much of it is either educational or entertaining.

Things for Sale

Master Thorfinn has copies of the *Update to the Armorial and Ordinary*, which includes names, badges and devices registered between May XXII and October XXII. If you own an *Armorial and Ordinary* then you *need* this book. It costs \$4.00, plus \$1.00 postage. Thorfinn's address is Steve Roylance, 1592 Malvern Road, Glen Iris 3146. If you still don't have a copy of the Armorial and Ordinary, and you think you need one, let Thorfinn know. If he gets enough takers he'll order another crate from the United States.

Thorsinn also has stocks of herald's pins: escutcheon-shaped enamel pins with a tie-pin fastening, about 1½ inches long, bearing the College of Heralds device. They're \$3.50 each, plus 50 cents postage. (If you don't know what an "escutcheon" is, then look it up now.)

This Month's Submissions

Six submissions were considered at the meeting on 12th May, and all six were forwarded to the Vesper Principal Herald for further consideration.

1. Catherine the Friendly (new, name and device) [River Haven]

Argent, above a base rayonné gules, a cooking pot sable, and on a chief sable a sewing needle fesswise Or.

The name was originally submitted as *Cathrine*. However, neither Withycombe nor Yonge list *Cathrine* as one of the variations of *Katharine*. The submittor allowed minor changes, so we've added an 'e' to create the more probable *Catherine*.

The device is her second alternate, and appears free of conflict.

The first alternate, Argent, above a base rayonné gules [blazoned as raguly on the history sheet, but we're sure this is what she meant], a cooking pot sable, overall in bend a sewing needle Or, is in visual conflict with the badge of the Atenveldt Cook's Guild: Or, above a base rayonné gules, a cauldron sable. Although I count a major for the field and a (small?) minor for the needle, there's a striking visual similarity.

Either way, the *rayonné* will need to be drawn with fewer, larger "teeth". In the submission they're a bit small. Five or six large teeth would be about right.

2. Duncan macAlpin Shieldsbane (new, name and device) [Stormhold]

Per chevron argent and sable, two ravens sable and an estoile argent within an orle counterchanged.

Duncan is in Withycombe (p.80). Duncan I ruled Scotland in 1034–40. macAlpin is common enough, especially since Alpin was "the name of at least two Pictish kings" (Scottish Christian Names, L A Dunkling, Johnson & Bacon 1978). Shieldsbane is a perfectly good epithet, if a little TSCA.

The device seems free of conflict. It should be well clear of Midlemore: Per chevron argent

and sable, in chief two cornish choughs sable (Papworth p.320).

[Note for newcomers: "TSCA" stands for "Typical SCA". When referring to a name, it means the kind of names that sound more like something from a fantasy novel than a "real" period name. Usually, TSCA is a neutral term. But it can also be used sarcastically, especially when referring to soppy fantasy names like "Brianna of the Misty Lake of the Unicorns" or complex epithets like "James the Wooden-Legged Coward".]

3. Rashid al Faqih (Resubmission to Crux Australis, name and device) [River Haven]

Per bend sinister Or and gules, between in chief three mullets gules and in base a crescent Or a

human sinister eye proper.

This gentle previously submitted under the name Rashid al-Fakim, which was returned by Crux Australis on 13th November XXII for further documentation. The new name uses elements documented by Da'ud ibn Auda, Obelisk Herald, in Proceedings of the Known World Heraldic Symposium AS XXII, pp47,49.

The original device submission, Gules, a human eye proper, between in chief three mullets and in base a crescent Or, was returned for conflict with George Mau of the Damned Alani Race: Gules, two chains crossed in saltire Or debruised by a human eye proper. This new submission clears the conflict, and appears free of other troubles.

4. Rohanna Nachteule (new, name and device) [River Haven]
Sable, an owl Or within a bordure argent charged with three dragons sejant vert.

The submittor "documents" Rohanna as a Latin name using The Complete Book of Baby Names, Herron Publications 1987. Finding the name in none of our usual sources, we've sent it on for comment. Nachteule is meant to be German for "night-owl"; if this is wrong the submittor will gladly have it changed to the correct form.

The device is the submittor's third choice. The first, Sable, an owl Or within a bordure argent charged with three dragons sejant vert, generated a lot of comment at the meeting. Almost everyone loudly complained that the tiny dragons sejant were indistinguishable. We believe we can invoke Rules for Submission AR6c on complexity, banning "details indistinguishable from a distance". The second alternative was no better, merely having six dragons instead of three.

This third version, with horse's heads instead of dragons, brought mixed feelings. Are horse's heads any more recognizable than dragons sejant? We checked the SCA Ordinary to discover the following relatively recent examples of charges on bordures: three thimbles (Meagan Windemere of Oakwood, Sept 85), three Latin crosses flory argent (Maria Elestr o'r Llynarian, Apr 86), five open books (Boethius, College of, Oct 84), and dolphins naiant (Hiodowechssun fon Hocheichhallu, Apr 86). Given this variety, we felt obliged to submit the device.

5. Simon de Lyons (name with Laurel, device resubmission to Crux Australis) [River Haven] Per bend ermine and counter ermine, two bendlets counterchanged sable and argent.

The original device submission, Ermine, on a bend sable three lions fesswise counter couchant argent was returned by Crux Australis on 13th October XXII for conflict with many devices in Papworth that went Ermine, on a bend sable.... This is a complete redesign, and appears free of conflict. It's clear of Iain MacBaird: Per bend ermine and counter-ermine a boar passant per bend sable and argent (Jul 84) by the "complete difference of sole charge" rule.

Steven Longshanks (holding name, change of registered device) [Stormhold]
 Per bend sinister gules and sable, a comet bend sinisterwise, head to chief, and an armoured leg embowed argent.

Steven's previous device was registered on 31st January AS XXII (1988): Per bend sinister wavy gules and argent, a comet bendwise sinister, head to chief, argent and on a heart gules a rose argent. This new design appears free of conflict.

One thought. Is it worth providing illustrations of these submissions each month? Those that get through to Vesper are illustrated the following month, and it'd mean a little more work for me. On the other hand, it might be useful to have pictures. What are your thoughts?

Last Words

As usual, I've also attached the portions of the Laurel Queen of Arms Letters of Acceptance and Return and the Minutes of the College of Heralds of the West Kingdom that refer to submissions from Lochac and Aneala. Those from Lochac are marked with an "L" in a circle, those from Aneala with an "A".

Angharad of Chester. Name and device. Vert, a fess dancetty ermine between three crosses flory argent and in chief a seahorse erect Or.

It should be noted that under the definition of "a group of charges" in the section on Determination of Difference, the crosses and the seahorse constitute two different groups of charges. This is not simply because of the difference in type and tincture of the charges, but because they are not in fact arranged as a group in a standard arrangement. The crosses do constitute a group of secondary charges as defined under subheading 2 ("One or more charges accompanying. . . an ordinary or primary charge."). The seahorse here is specifically emblazoned in one of the most common traditional positions for a brisure mark (centered in chief) and in fact looks like a brisure mark added to cadet arms. As such, it is specifically covered by subhead 3 ("A secondary charge that is obviously not associated with other

secondary charges, such as a bordure, a chief, an orle, or a brisure.")

- (L) Edmund the Lame. Name only.
- GereInt Scholar. Spelling Correction.

 When the gentle's name and device were passed in September, 1986, the given name was accidentally spelled Geraint.
- Gwenhwyfar Trelowarth. Name only.

 White in his Handbook of Cornish Surnames (p. 55) gives "tre-lowarth", meaning "homestead with garden", as the derivation for Treloar, which is the lady's mundane family name. If she wishes a totally Cornish name, she might be interested in knowing that "Gweniver" is the form of the given name in older Cornish records (Names from the Cornish, p. 28).
 - Kane Greymane. Name only.
 Under "Cain" Reaney (p. 61) cites forms such as "Kein" (1198-1200), "Keyne" (1260), "McKane" (1408), derived several different given names.
- Morgan of the Eagle's Nest. Name and device. Per pale azure and sable, a cross of four pallets fretted with four barrulets, between in chief two mullets argent.
 - Rhlannon of Rosebriar. Name and device. Quarterly sable and gules, a garden rose bendwise, slipped and leaved, within a bordure argent.

The mundane arms of Thrale ("Sable, a rose argent, a bordure of the last.") were cited as a potential conflict. In addition to the minor point of difference for the field, there would seem to be at least a clear major point of difference for the changes to the rose. By tradition the Society has distinguished between the heraldic rose and the natural rose and, lacking any specific evidence to the contrary we must assume that the rose on the arms of Thrale was the heraldic rose which is quite different in appearance from the natural flower. The rose on the arms of Thrale is not slipped and leaved as is the rose here (if it were, the visual difference between the heraldic rose and the natural rose would be considerably diminished). Finally, we assume the rose on the arms of Thrale is in the default position at the centre of the field, not bendwise as is the rose here.

- Saint Bartholomew, College of. Name and device. Per saltire sable and azure, a laurel wreath between four open books in cross argent, each book charged with a bee tergiant sable, marked Or.

 Please ask them to draw the laurel wreath bigger.
- Seóan Seaxawain. Name only (see RETURNS for device).
- (L) Simon de Lyons. Name only..
- (A) Snorri Ottarsson. Device. Sable, a serpent nowed, head erect, on a bordure argent, an orle sable.

The following submissions were returned by the Laurel Queen of Arms on 21st February XXII (1988)

Abertridwr, Canton of. Name only.

There was a substantial feeling that this name conflicted by translation with the Barony of Three Rivers in Calontir. The problem of the Shire of Riversmeet (East) was also raised by several of the Laurel staff.

Diarmid O Lorcain. Change of device. Sable, a bordure erminois.

The submittor appealed the return of this device by Vesper for conflict with the mundane arms of Bass' ("Sable, a bordure argent.") and the submission of his alternate device to the College (it was registered in December, 1987). After much discussion, we cannot agree with the contention of Crux Australis that the change from argent to erminois is worth a major and a minor point since two distinct changes are made: this is not a change from one tincture to another with a further addition of charges but rather a change from one recognized heraldic tincture to another (that one of the tinctures is a fur is interesting but does not add extra difference).

Riverhaven, Barony of. Badge for the Order of the Bridged Tower. Azure, two towers conjoined by a doubly arched bridge Or.

Conflict with the mundane arms of Cassat ("Azure, a castle Or.", as cited in Papworth, p. 364). Crescend was quite correct in mentioning the strong resemblance of the conjoint charge to a standard depiction of a castle: there is not the required difference here.

Seóan Seaxswain. Device. Per chevron argent and sable, an annulet counterchanged.

Technically, this is in conflict with the mundane arms of Doolan ("Gyronny of eight sable and argent, an annulet counterchanged.", cited in Papworth, p. 4). All the examples in the Rules for Submission make it clear that the "automatic sufficient difference" for counterchange is intended to apply only between a plain field charged and a divided field with the same charge counterchanged along the line of division. In this case only the type of line of division is changed.

E	Blanca del Coniglio. Change of name from holding name of Blanca of Dismal Fogs.
E	Blessed Herman the Cripple, College of. Device. Per pale Or and argent, a closed book palewise, spine to dexter, gules, clasped and charged with a laurel wreath Or, all within a bordure embattled azure.
(E)	Elffin of Mona. Device. Vert, an annulet rayonny on the outer edge argent and in chief a sword fesswise proper.
0	Eric of Stormwind. Name only.
	Lochac, Principality of. Name for the Order of the Iron Spoon.
	Robin the Ruthless in Battel. Name and device. Gules, a scorpion tergiant, maintaining in each pincer a heart, and in base within the curve of its tail another heart, all Or.

The following submissions were returned by the Laurel Queen of Arms on 19th March XXII (1988)

Delbert of Swabla. Change of name from holding name of David of Aneala.

Noone in the College was able to document the protheme "Del-" as an identifiable separate element in German, Old English or any other Germanic language. He stated that he would accept Adalbert as an alternative. Unfortunately, even that is not really an option since Adalbert and Albrecht are variant of the same German name (Yonge, p. 410) and thus the proposed name conflicts with Albrecht von Swabia, the Clumsy (who is generally referred to without his byname).

The following submissions were returned by the Vesper Principal Herald on 10th April XXII (1988)

Aelfwine of Peterborough

Name submitted, new device returned.

Or, a heraldic tyger queue-fourchee passant holding a scimitar erect sable

between three crosses crosslet fitchy azure.

The device is too similar to that registered to William the Silent: "Or, a natural panther passant guardant sable". The difference between a tyger and a panther is not that great, and the scimitar and forked tail do not contribute sufficent additional difference. His allowed alternate, making the tyger "incensed azure", does not add measurable difference.

Mac-tire Lochan, Canton of

New name and device returned.

Barry wavy azure and argent, a laurel wreath vert and on a chief wavy argent. two wolf's heads erased to sinister sable.

This is the name and device submission for a new canton of the Barony of Aneala. It was given to us by the Kingdom Seneschale and did not include the required petition signed by the members of the branch. Even if the name and device had been accepta

they would have to have been held for the petition.

The name seems to be incorrectly constructed. Nac-tire, which literally means "son of the land", is the Gaelic phrase used to mean "wolf". Lochan is a Gaelic word-meaning "pool". The submittors state that they wish a name meaning "Wolf's Lake". Since Gaelic inverts word order and mutates, and since the Gaelic word for "lake" is actually Loch, the correct form for "Wolf's Lake" would seem to be Loch Mic Tire. . If they would accept "Wolf's Pool", the form would be Lochan Mic Tire. Neither of these would have a hyphen.

The device submission is too similar to that registered to the March of Gwyntarian: "Azure, two bars wavy argent, overall a laurel wreath vert, a chief nebuly argent".

Saraid na Sterrin

New name and device returned.

Purpure goutty d'eau, a chief invected argent.

The given name is cited on p.161 of O'Corrain & Maguire as a female name. The submittor states that na Sterrin is Irish Gaelic for "of the storm". Our sources indicate that "of the storm" would be either na Stoirme or na Doineamne, and show nothing like what the submittor sent. She will allow no changes, so the name will have to be returned for documentation.

The device submission is technically in conflict with the device registered to Alexandria du Bois d'Arc: "Purpure, an ark and a chief invected argent". The device is not eligible for complete difference of charge, since the number of charges is not identical, and we cannot invoke number, since a field semy has no definite number of charges to count.

William Eleison

New name and device returned.

Or, two chevrons cotised and in base an armored arm fesswise embowed sable. William is a common given name. Eleison is a Greek word meaning "have mercy", most commonly found in the part of the Catholic Mass called the Kyrie, where the phrases "Kyrie eleison; Christe eleison" ("Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy") are repeated. It is not a surname, although it is similar to many surnames like Ellison and Eliason, both patronymics.

The submittor allowed no changes, although he wrote William Alison near the paragraph about holding names. We interpreted this as a statement that, while he would not accept changes, he would be willing to accept that as a holding name. However, according to College of Arms policy, holding names cannot be given at Kingdom level, and we are not allowed to forward names to Laurel that are known to be unacceptable.

The device seems acceptable, but cannot be forwarded without an acceptable name.
