Blazon: Purpure a dismembered lion passant maintaining in its dexter paw a torch, environed of a

laurel wreath or.

Submission Details:

This groups name was register in January/Febuary 1993. The previous device submission of Per pale gules and vert, a two-headed merman erect affronty, heads addorsed argent, maintaining in dexter hand a tourch Or enflamed tenné and in sinister hand an open book, between in fess two laurel wreaths Or. was returned at the time for being too complex and lack of contrast of the flame.

Whilst the dismembering is unusual and I am not sure it is period, the only example I could find was the arms of Maitland, blazoned variously as Or, a lion rampant dismembered gules, [2] and [3] and Or, a lion rampant couped at the joints Gules [1], but none are dated.

Only one petition was sent, I am being lenient this time but I may not be this nice in future! See last months CAM(e)L.

This ladies previous name submission of Seaná Dúnlaith Ó Seachnasaigh was returned by Vesper, for having a double given name and a non documentable name Seaná. On the basis of Harpy's advice that Seóna would be a reasonable Gaelic form of the submittors mundane name Shona. Dunliath is constructed locative meaning gray Fortress and according to the return nighean/inghean Sheachnasaigh are acceptable parontymic forms. The change of nighean to ní should be relatively minor.
